## Register Now: Flu Shot & COVID Booster Clinic at FSC on 10/5

Student Health will be at the Facilities Services Complex on Wednesday, October 5th from 9a-2p for anyone who would like to receive a flu shot or keep their COVID vaccination status up to date. All FS employees are eligible to receive flu vaccines, and fully vaccinated individuals are eligible for updated COVID boosters if it has been at least 2 months since their last dose of vaccine. COVID boosters are free, and flu vaccines are free to employees enrolled in the state's health insurance plan. Otherwise, flu shots are \$25 payable by cash or check. Financial assistance may be available. See flyer at end of Weekly for additional details (including sign-up information).

# GET UP TO DATE

## Updated COVID-19 boosters and flu vaccines are available now!



Staying up-to-date on seasonal and recommended vaccines is the best way to protect yourself from serious illness. To support our staff, Facilities Services and the Student Health Center are partnering to host an employee vaccine clinic. Vaccines are also available Monday - Friday at the Student Health Center Pharmacy.

### WHAT VACCINES ARE AVAILABLE

Seasonal flu vaccine and updated COVID-19 boosters

### WHO IS ELIGIBLE

All Facilities Services employees are eligible to receive flu vaccines. Fully vaccinated individuals are eligible for updated COVID boosters if it has been at least 2 months since their last dose of vaccine. Employees interested in primary series COVID-19 vaccines should visit [tiny.utk.edu/vaccines](https://tiny.utk.edu/vaccines) for an appointment

### WHAT IS THE COST

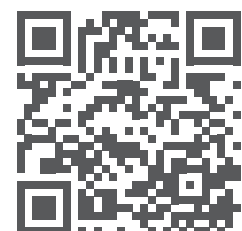
